

TRANSITION

Key concepts of ISO 9001:2015 are covered during the course, including:

- Evolution, not revolution – the development of ISO 9001:2015
- The seven quality principles of ISO 9001:2015
- The updated Plan-Do-Check-Act cycle
- Emphasis on a process approach
- Context – considering all stakeholders, not just the customer
- Focusing on internal as well as external parties
- The concept of documented information
- The removal of ‘exclusions’ from ISO 9001
- The role of top management in driving the system
- The inclusion of ‘risks’ and ‘opportunities’ as a requirement within the standard
- The new demand for sophisticated auditing and interview-based determination of conformance

Candidates will be required to pass the continuous assessment during the course, as well as sitting a 30-minute written test.

Course Materials

Students will receive a comprehensive course manual with reference materials.

Reference copies of ISO 9000, ISO 9001, ISO 9004, ISO17021 and ISO 19011 will be available for the classroom based course.

Certification

A Certificate of achievement is awarded to all learners who complete the course successfully and pass the written test. N.B. Existing ISO 9001: 2008 IRCA/CQI Registered Auditors must complete a recognised transition course by September 2018 in order to be able to update their Auditor Registration to cover ISO 9001:2015.

ISO 9001: 2015 QMS Auditor Transition



Course Overview

This two-day course is specifically designed for IRCA Registered ISO 9001:2008 QMS Auditors who need to update their knowledge and skills to the 2015 version of ISO 9001. (In order to maintain your registration CQI and IRCA require that you successfully complete a registered Transition Course by September 2018).

As well as being useful for existing IRCA-registered QMS auditors the Course is also useful for anyone who wishes to find out more about the latest version of ISO 9001 and how it can assure quality for an organisation.

To keep lectures to a minimum most of the learning is achieved through carefully designed exercises - particularly performing simulated audits to the new standard. The Course provides details of the ISO 9001:2015 standard, the seven quality principles that drive ISO 9001, as well as the changes and evolution of ISO 9001 in the 2015 iteration.

Aims and Objectives

This course aims to give a clear understanding of ISO 9001:2015, and illustrate the key themes of this iteration. It will also focus on developing the practical skills auditors will need when working towards compliance with this standard.

On successfully completing these modules delegates will:

- Know and understand Annex SL as a framework for ISO management systems
- Know and understand the requirements of ISO 9001:2015
- Be able to audit ISO 9001:2015 based QMS requirements effectively

Duration

This is a two-day 'classroom-based' course.

Course Pre-requisites

While this course is designed for existing ISO 9001:2008 IRCA-registered QMS auditors and lead auditors, there are no formal qualifications required for entry to this course, and it will be of great use to anyone who wishes to understand more about how ISO 9001 is adapting to the needs of the modern world.

Who should attend

Existing ISO 9001:2008 IRCA-registered QMS auditors and lead auditors. Also anyone who wishes to understand how ISO 9001 is evolving to meet the needs of today's workplace, whether they are senior management, auditors, consultants, implementers, or quality professionals.

Content

This course is designed to keep lectures to a minimum, and includes a real auditing exercise on a sophisticated company simulation, assessing whether the company has successfully managed transition from ISO 9001:2008 to ISO 9001:2015.

The course is a combined course in that it covers the following two IRCA modules in parallel. (Experience has shown that covering module 1 on day 1 and module 2 on day 2 meant that much of day 2 was repetitive of day 1.)

- Module 1 looks at changes arising as a result of the adoption of annex SL
- Module 2 Covers changes arising as a result of amendments to the quality management system (QMS) specific content of ISO 9001:2008
